

### A Year of Growth, Resiliency, & Hope

How do you reflect back on a year like 2020? I think it's easy to focus on the stress, pain, and worry of the last year. But 2020 was also a gift. Adversity is the test of character, and 2020 taught us so much about our agency and our partners like you.

As we entered into a world of pandemic and quarantine, there was understandably a lot of fear. The concern I heard most from the team focused on our ability to serve our clients. How could we continue our work while keeping ourselves and the clients safe? This was a challenge that had never been faced beforethere was no playbook or example we could look to.But the enormity and gravity of this challenge did not dissuade this team.



In fact, we faced the challenge head on- delivering vital supplies and food to clients quarantined in hotels and homes; sending out care packages filled with coloring books and fuzzy socks and fancy lotions to make sure kids still felt seen and loved; traveling with two camping chairs in the trunk so services like therapy could still be provided in the safety of the outdoors; taking extra precautions and safety measures to create a safe and clean space for the most vulnerable of those we serve; braving the post office every week because clients were waiting on vital documents; shifting our entire course catalog onto a virtual platform so that we didn't miss a single opportunity to educate our community partners. In short, when the world stopped turning, our team kicked it into high gear.

But it was not just the tenacity and passion of our team that was tested last year. We knew that this pandemic affected everyone, including our community partners and supporters. We also knew that priorities and focus might justifiably shift during a period of so much chaos and uncertainty. But just like the test of our client care, last year showed us the incredible character of our supporters and community partners.

Time and time again, our partners showed up and walked along beside us as we navigated this new world. Whether it was sponsoring our new transitional housing program, helping us create a therapy garden for clients, providing dinner for clients in our shelter, or making our first ever virtual fundraiser the most successful in our agency's history, our community made the last year possible. Letters of support and encouragement sent throughout the year bolstered our spirits and our efforts. We were able to face last year because of you.

While it may be easy to write off 2020 as a horrible, no-good, very bad year, you can see why it was also a year that brought us so much. It brought us growth, resiliency, and hope. And it brought us these things because of your support and dedication to our agency and our mission. We can't wait to see what we accomplish together next!


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### Your Partnership Sparks Change

Ariana is a 35-year-old female with a college education who, through a series of unfortunate events, found herself homeless and battling a substance addiction. What hurt Ariana the most was losing custody of her children. After spending some time in jail, Ariana was referred to Grow Free through her probation officer to help separate her from her traffickers and facilitate the necessary support for getting herself back on her feet.

Ariana acknowledged that her vulnerability to victimization was influenced by inconsistency in maintaining housing and having her basic needs met. From day one, Ariana was determined to use this opportunity to maximize the potential she knew she had. Our safe house allowed Ariana the solid foundation she needed to begin to organize her goals and determine the steps she needed to take to achieve them. Immediately, the CCAHT staff recognized her potential and praised the diligence and dedication shown by Ariana. Ariana acknowledges Grow Free's empowerment approach, as evidenced by her statement: "I appreciate the opportunity y'all have given me to show that I'm a responsible adult." Grow Free staff have worked around the clock to provide encouragement and support toward Ariana's success, but the hard work and passion Ariana has shown is admirable, to say the least.

Ariana is working diligently toward earning a job and housing of her own. She is able to see her children almost daily while still maintaining sobriety and compliance with her terms of probation. Ariana works with our therapist and her personal care coordinator as she forges a new path of opportunity for herself. Ariana recently expressed her gratitude and said, "There are not even words to express how happy I am to be where I'm at right now in life and a lot of that has to do with the people I've met being in this house... it makes me so happy that you all are so proud of me and in my corner."


In 2020, we received 226 referrals for survivors in need of help and actively served 157 survivors of all ages and genders.

This pandemic has really revealed to us the true value of face to face, human interaction. While it's been an incredibly frustrating season, it's also forced growth upon us in being creative with staying connected to clients. While working a program through a screen is not preferred, it's sometimes all we can do. Staying consistent with our clients has been the most critical and impactful component of adapting to so many unexpected changes. Many have shared that logging on with us is the best part of their week.

Because of your support, we have been able to deliver materials, meals, and clothes to kid's homes with little fun surprises. Even something as small as a new notebook or some candy has been quite impactful in lifting spirits when we can't meet in person. It's making small gestures of effort that show others you care and you're still here, no matter what.

This year has changed what we thought possible for client care. We will carry these new lessons with us moving forward for the duration of our time working with survivors, and we will never be the same because of it, in the very best way. When you operate with the same established patterns for so long, you almost forget the power of raw creativity. I think the pandemic was a real "drawing board" moment for us all. You're not sure what to do or how you'll move forward, you just know that you will.

## Phoenix House

Phoenix House is best described as a Transitional Housing intensive outpatient program (IOP). Phoenix House offers apartment-style independent living, with the safety net and support system of Grow Free TN staff, and a dynamic therapeutic IOP program that promotes healing and recovery through individual, group, physical, and creative therapies.

Residents participate in groupbased therapies 3 days per week, with an additional hour of individual therapy. During the 5month program, residents receive intensive support to ensure they are ready to smoothly transition into independent housing upon their graduation.

Phoenix House provides Grow Free TN with the opportunity to work with an individual beyond the limitations of crisis-response and acute needs to enhance the impact we are able to have on the lives of those we serve.

## A Ney-Normal




## Financial Impact


